They are not free!

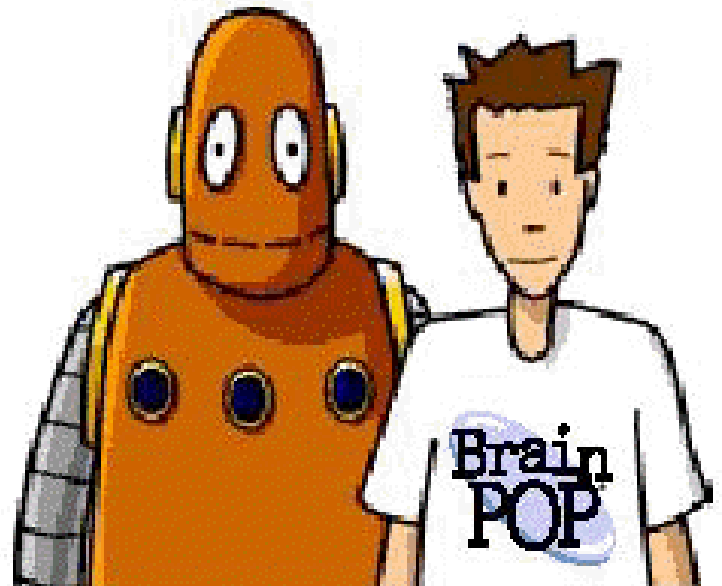

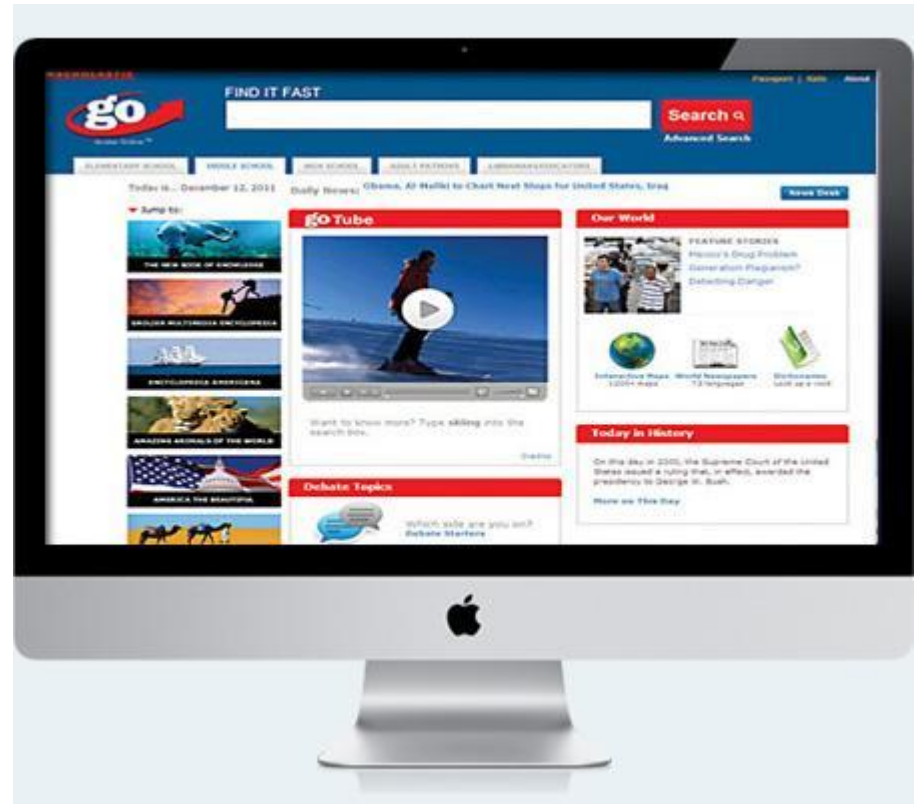

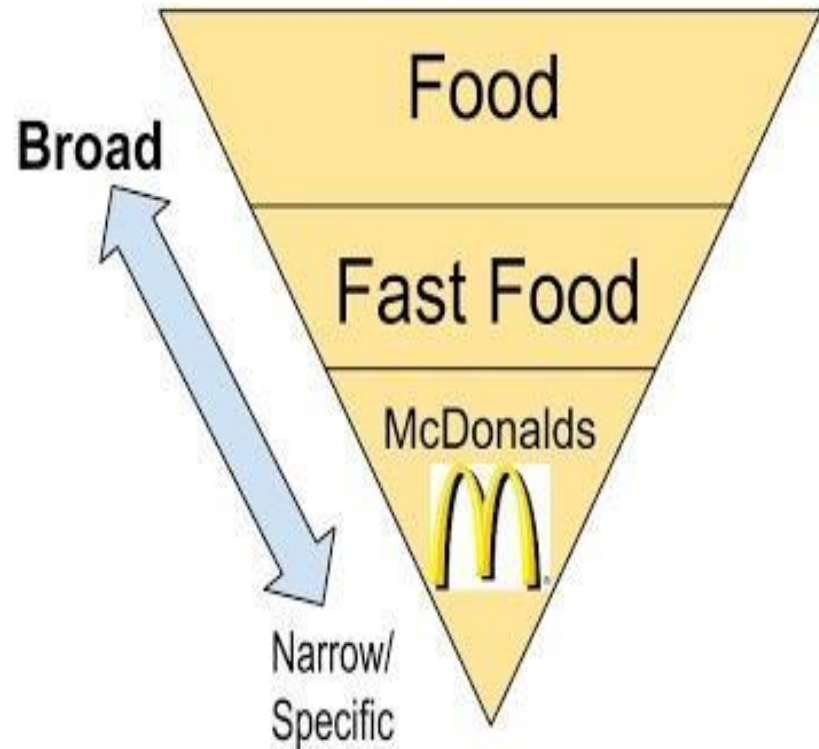
